- I will play hockey because I want to, not because others or coaches want me to
- I will play by the rules of hockey, and in the spirit of the game
- I will control my temper – fighting and “mouthing off” can spoil the activity for everybody
- I will respect my opponents
- I will do my best to be a true team player
- I will remember that winning isn’t everything – that having fun, improving skills, making friends and doing my best are also important
- I will acknowledge all good plays/performances – those of my team and of my opponents
- I will remember that coaches and officials are there to help me. I will accept their decisions and show them respect.
- I will co-operate with my coach, teammates, officials and opponents.
- I will respect the facilities and the rink staff.
- I will not conduct myself in a disrespectful manner. Disrespectful is defined as action or words deemed rude, unpleasant, inappropriate, or unprofessional and found to be offensive to others.
- I will not conduct myself in a way that would be deemed a travesty to the game by using profane or threatening abusive language, gestures or actions towards any person. Such actions may also be described as verbal or physical taunts or gestures that intend to humiliate, demean, belittle cause offense to or harm the reputation of the person or group targeted.
- I will cooperate and not obstruct the Association should an incident take place and the Complaint Resolution Policy be utilized. This will be for the betterment of the Association, its players and the spirit of the game.
